

Hey Nathan.

I hope this finds you well.

As you may know we offer a summer youth program called STOMP (Skagit's Totally Outrageous Mobile Playground). We started it last year to help alleviate the void of childcare options after Best SELF closed. Basically it is a very inexpensive recreation program for children 6-12 years old. STOMP runs Monday thru Thursday for 9 weeks and every week has a different, fun theme. Each day our staff of 3 employees set up in a new area around the county and lead the children in games, arts and craft projects and special activities. Monday we are in Conway, Tuesday the Allen/Burlington area, Wednesday the Playfields in Mount Vernon and Thursday in the Sedro Woolley area. The drop-in fee is only \$10.00 per day per child from 9:00 am - 4:00 pm. Or parents can sign their children up for all Thursdays for only \$89.00 which includes a tee shirt too. The limit is 30 children per day.

Last year on Thursdays we set up at Northern State Recreation Area. We thought that would be a

good location with lots to do and expose new people to one of our up and coming parks. Unfortunately many people said it was too far to drive and the kids did not like it because it did not have a playground. Therefore we are looking for another venue that might be better in the immediate Sedro Woolley area.

The staff and I did a quick drive around Sedro Woolley yesterday and wondered if there may be a chance that we could set up STOMP in either Memorial Park or Riverfront Park this summer. I'm not sure who I would need to speak to about the possibility of this working. You? Shane Walley? Mike Anderson?

Please let me know what you think and/or who I should contact about the possibility. It is a really great program and I'm sure it would benefit many Sedro Woolley youth.

Thanks for your time and any help with this.
